## **Agricultural Crop Report**

In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit a report of the agricultural production for Alameda County for calendar year 1980. This report deals with the gross value of production and does not attempt to reflect net farm income nor costs of production and marketing.

The gross value of all commodities produced was the highest on record, \$60,745,400. This represents an increase of \$563,700 above 1979 production. This increase can be attributed primarily to greater levels of production and higher prices being paid for certain commodities.

Data for the preparation of this report has been obtained from producers, processors, representatives of agribusiness and individuals with special knowledge in the field. Their assistance and cooperation is sincerely appreciated. I would also like to express my appreciation to the members of my staff for their effort in the preparation of this report.
