After reducing emissions by over 30% from the 2003 baseline through the 2010-2020 Climate Action Plan for Government Services and Operations (GOCAP), the County is working on an updated GOCAP to be finalized this year. The Office of Sustainability leads GOCAP development.

I led the team in the creation of an online feedback forum using the Consider.It platform for civic dialogue to solicit feedback from the Alameda County community on draft GOCAP measures.
