

## Program Name / Project Descriptions

Goal: Enhance Alameda County's composting and recycling service to divert materials from the landfill and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

- **1. Adding Infrastructure:**
- Designing new waste enclosures.
- Completing site assessments, waste audits and interviews.
- Coordinating with occupants, janitorial, architects, and waste haulers to balance the needs of the various stakeholders and create site specific plans.
- Adding new containers and signage.
- 2. Outreach:
- Training people on how to compost and recycle and why it's important, including: janitors, employees from a number of different agencies, mental health patients, youth and the public.
- Creating and updating printed outreach materials, such as: signs, fliers, posters, and stickers; as well as creating video outreach materials and lesson plans.





# Waste Reduction at Alameda County

- Added service to 9 buildings.
- Updated services at 7 others.
- **Conducted outreach and education to over** 350 employees and members of the public.
- **Diverted an estimated 2,146 tons of waste** from landfills annually.
- Kept 1,890 tons of GHGs from being emitted from landfills annually.

to rush one at a time, was key.

- Continue expanding service to owned County Facilities.

## Achievements / Results / Outcomes



• Patience, Persistence, Politeness: working with the number of different stakeholders that it takes to roll out a new waste service can mean each project takes a long, long time. Learning to balance a large number of projects, all of which move slowly, rather than trying

Once all facilities have been reached, revisit and update all outreach materials and initiate a county-wide compost and recycling education and outreach campaign

Design centralized waste collection, rather than desk side collection, into all new buildings.
